Dear Friends

This week I was at the William Gilbert harvest service, and had the opportunity to reflect on 2 Corinthians 9:6-9, and I thought I would share that reflection with you, to help us think about giving.

The most striking verse in the passage is probably verse 7:

2 Corinthians 9:7 Each one must give as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Paul is writing to the Corinthians encouraging them to give generously for the collection for those suffering hardship in Jerusalem, in 2 Corinthians 8-9, and as he comes to the end of his exhortation, we read these words: *for God loves a cheerful giver.*

But what makes our giving cheerful? Perhaps we can be cheerful because we have plenty – and giving is therefore no hardship. Perhaps we give cheerfully because we recognize the need. Or perhaps we give cheerfully because we love the one to whom we are giving the gift – Christmas is like that. But sometimes these reasons won't apply. How can we give cheerfully?

Paul gives us two reasons. The first is the one we often remember at Harvest – that God gives us all the things that we need – the earth is the Lord's and everything in it. We remember that God is our creator who supplies our needs. Verse 9 reminds us of this:

2 Corinthians 9:9 As it is written, "He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever."

Thank you to all those people who volunteered to do refreshments in the evening services.


The completed rota is available on the back table in church. If you would like to volunteer as a reserve, please let the office know. Thank you.

2 Corinthians 8:9 For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.

We are reminded of God's grace to us in sending Jesus who, although rich in heaven and having all power and authority, came down to earth, becoming poor – and more than that, enduring the poverty of dying on the cross for us, for our sins, that we might become rich, having peace and a restored relationship with God. And so we give cheerfully, because we are responding cheerfully to God's goodness to us.
