The Trinity

- The person and work of Christ Jesus is God 1:1, 1:18, 20:28; I am statements
- The relationship between Father and Son
- The role of the Holy Spirit

5.3 John's letters

Author:

Date: early 90's

Purpose:

1 John: Jesus came in the flesh, and genuine belief in him works out in obedience to God and love for his people

2 John: a letter to a church warning about the dangers of traveling preachers who are false teachers – walk in truth and love

3 John: to Gaius warning about Diotrephes, and the abuse of power

The false teaching (comes through most clearly in 1 John)

- Docetism
- Perfectionism
- Antinomianism

1 John emphasises:

- humanity of Christ
- future eschatology
- test the Spirits
- reminder vs. claims of sinlessness

 - 2. Love for one another 3:11-24
 - 3. Correct Christology 4:1-6
- IV. The tests of life: cycle three 4:7-5:21
 - 1. Love for one another 4:7-21
 - 2. Correct Christology 5:1-15
 - 3. Sin vs life 5:16-21
